When Seconds Count, The Cops Aren't Coming: PD Advises Using Air Horns To Alert Neighbors To Intruders Because No Cops Will Come As Bay Area Crime Turns Into SF Apocalypse
Democrats in DC, Oakland Sound Alarms Over Rising Crime: "Amid a surge in crime in Oakland, California, police have advised residents to use air horns to alert neighbors to intruders and add security bars to their doors and windows."

As Legal Insurrection previously reported, the crime situation in Oakland, California has gotten so dire that even the city's woke NAACP division wrote a blistering letter to city leaders urging action while blaming progressive policies, Soros-funded District Attorney Pamela Price, and the Defund the Police movement for making criminals feel like it is open season on residents:
"Failed leadership, including the movement to defund the police, our District Attorney's unwillingness to charge and prosecute people who murder and commit life threatening serious crimes, and the proliferation of anti-police rhetoric have created a heyday for Oakland criminals. If there are no consequences for committing crime in Oakland, crime will continue to soar."
The letter got the attention of CNN of all places, which sent a crew out to interview frustrated residents and community leaders, some of who are fed up to the point they're packing up and leaving because they don't even feel safe walking outside of their homes:
The upswing in crime has forced some Oakland residents, including Kristin Cook, to flee to other states. Cook watched with tears in her eyes as a moving pod packed with all her family's belongings was loaded onto a flatbed truck.
Although she's lived in Oakland her whole life, Cook said she's now moving to Texas for the sake of her son.
"I love Oakland I can't take it anymore," she said. "I got to the point I was too scared to leave my house."
She said the rise in carjackings has made her scared to take drives at night, a pastime she once enjoyed.
"My son is about to start driving I'm terrified my son is gonna be killed at a stop sign because he's driving an Impala, and I just can't, I can't risk it."
Another resident, who lives across the street from the home of a man who was recently murdered as he was trimming his hedges, says she's staying and believes things will change, but that the police have advised the use of air horns to alert neighbors to suspicious and/or criminal activity in the meantime:
After 60-year-old retiree David Schneider was shot and killed here while trimming a tree in his yard, his neighbor, Toni Bird, said she retreated indoors.
"People aren't feeling safe out of their house," she said. "It makes sense that you would want to protect your house then, right? You would barricade it."
Amid a surge in crime in Oakland, California, police have advised residents to use air horns to alert neighbors to intruders and add security bars to their doors and windows.
Bird, who moved to Oakland 2 1/2 years ago, said she took their advice to heart. She now has three air horns and five security cameras around her home.

A similar situation is also playing out in Washington, D.C., where violent crime <u>has risen</u> so sharply that some <u>soft-on-crime</u> Democrat DC Council members are now <u>calling for help</u> from the National Guard:

"The crime is out of control and getting worse by the day. We must declare an emergency regarding the crime and violence in our neighborhoods and act urgently. It may be time to call on the National Guard to protect the children and innocent people that are losing their lives to this senselessness," [Councilmember Trayon] White said. "I am tired of burying our children. We are too comfortable with the state of our city. We must take action to gain control and protect our residents. Law enforcement is only one part of how we combat public safety issues. It will take all of us to heal our community."

After noting that it would take a community-wide effort to take back the city, White declared that "We are in a war zone."

"Bad things happen when good people do nothing," he also stated.

Before and after pictures have laid bare the mass exodus of huge brands from the city of San Francisco.
The video, made up of Google Maps screen grabs, shows large chain stores like Target and CVS before and after they moved out of the city.
Hordes of brand names including the likes of Whole Food and Nordstrom have recently moved out of the California city amid widespread crime and plummeting footfall.
The city has also struggled for years with rampant fentanyl use and fatal overdoses, and is on pace for its deadliest year yet.
In the first five months of 2023, preliminary reports show there were 346 overdose deaths in the city - an increase of more than 40 percent from the same period in 2022.
Economists have warned the city is spiraling into an 'urban doom loop' - a vicious circle of interconnected trends and forces that send cities into economic and social ruin

Big box retailer Office Depot also closed this location, leaving just one remaining open in the city
In the video, derelict shopfronts are shown for CBS, Target, Office Depot and Walgreens.
The Office Depot store pictured in the clip closed down in April of this year, while the Crate & Barrel store that was pictured closed in February of last year.
High theft has proved a problem in the area recently, with a Walgreens in the city center resolving to chaining their freezers to stop shoplifters.

Over the past few months, dozens of retailers announced they would be vacating the downtown area of the city.

Retail stalwart Old Navy announced they would be shuttering their flagship store in the area last month, becoming the latest chain to exit the city.
It comes after retail giant Nordstrom announced they would be closing all of their locations in the city.
The company said that due to the 'changing dynamics' of San Francisco it would be shuttering all remaining stores in the next few months.
In April, Whole Foods announced it was closing all their locations, with Anthropologie and Office Depot having also made the same decisions.
These stores joined the growing list of stores that have abandoned the coastal city, including H&M, Marshall's, Gap and Banana Republic.
Whole Foods had opened a new 'flagship' location at Trinity Place in the city's Tenderloin District in March of last year.

The company had hoped to revitalize footfall after two years of COVID-19 restrictions severely impacted business in the area.

A year on and the organic food giant declared they would be closing their store 'for the time being' over safety concerns.

A disturbing recent report showed 95 retailers in downtown San Francisco have closed since the start of the COVID pandemic, a decline of more than 50 percent.

Out of 203 retailers open in 2019 in the city's Union Square area, just 107 are still operating, a drop of 47 percent in just a few pandemic-ravaged years.
